





Dear Parents,

Opportunity for musical training is being made available in our school's band program. We hope that you will give consideration to this important cultural phase of your child's total education.

We are currently making plans for organizing the new beginner's band classes for next year's sixth graders. Scheduling of classes for next fall is done well in advance, and our counselors have asked us to be sure that students considering being in the beginner band class register for it at this time.

To insure the success of our sixth grade beginner's class, we will get a "head start" by offering a summer beginner's program in August. (A more detailed time schedule will be forthcoming.) These summer beginner's band classes will be held at our Band Hall, will be taught by our band staff, and will be free of charge. They are also taught in small groups of like-instruments, and are flexible enough to allow for such things as vacations and baseball or basketball practice.

Parental interest and the proper type of instrument are the most important parts of insuring your student's musical success. The years of experience your local band directors have had in the instrumental field, plus the fact that they are responsible for the musical progress of each band member, means that they should have the opportunity for counseling you and before securing an instrument. There are many instruments on the market today that are of inferior quality. Most used instruments are not in immediate playing condition. We feel that we can best serve you and your child if you will consult with us before you obligate yourself for any instrument you might have or may be considering. If you have an used instrument that you are considering, bring it with you to the meeting on Wednesday so we can check it over. Some instruments will definitely handicap any student, especially a beginning player who knows nothing of the process of playing correctly. We do not presume to dictate where or how you procure an instrument, but do feel that we alone are best qualified in our community to advise as to type and suitable brand of an instrument.

We have made arrangements with the most reliable school music company that we know of to serve as a source of information and rental instruments during this week. They will be available to you at our Band Hall as noted below. It is recommended that you rent an instrument for a trial period, while "trying on" band. You may discuss later with this music company, if you wish, the purchase of an instrument for your child. They have only those instruments we have checked over for proper playing qualities. They maintain complete quality control over their products, backed up by a service warranty.

We are very proud of our band program in Pearsall and hope you will give favorable consideration of an important phase in your child's education.

The band's presentations at a UIL Concert and Sight Reading "Contest" is very much like the TAAS tests that our schools have been preparing for: the concert portion evaluates the ability of each band to perform music that each has chosen to "show off" its best qualities; the sight reading portion is evaluating the bands ability to read and perform with only seven minutes of study, a piece of music selected by a state committee

to measure these skills in bands within various classifications across the state. Each of our two Jr. High bands and two high school bands that participated in this UIL evaluation received a Superior I rating in the Sight Reading portion. The high school first band under the direction of Mr. Daniel and Edward Aleman, received a Superior I rating in both Sight Reading and Concert.

Mr. Daniel Aleman stated, "I am very proud of the accomplishments of each of our bands this year. All of our bands, each year, are challenged to the maximum with extremely difficult music, each





Class 3A bands will perform from 4:30 p.m. onwards, beginning with Somerset, followed by Cotulla at 4:45 p.m., Crystal City, Ingram Tom Moore, Bandera, Devine, Pearsall at 6 p.m., Carrizo Springs and Hondo.

Band directors for Pearsall's Maverick Band are Daniel and Edward Aleman, Lura Stevens and Adan Salinas; directors for the Cotulla Cowboy Band are Debbie Brundrett and Jaime Martinez; directors for the Dilley Grey Wolf Band are Terri Robertson, Sergio Mendez and Naomi Mendez.






PHS Marching Band Advances to State

Maverick Band Set For State Contest





The 160-member band was the largest to participate at the state model in Class 3-A competition.


The band advanced to the state meet after receiving top scores at a










"It was a tiring trip," the di-





ELIGIBILITY

Any marching band earning a Division I in Regional competition may enter the State Marching Band Contest.

DATE

The State Marching Band Contest will be held December 3 and 4, 1979 at Memorial Stadium, The University of Texas at Austin.

ENTRY

 Entry forms are due on/before November 1, 1979. If a dispute should arise over the date of the entry, the U.S. Postmark will be accepted as the entry date.

 In regions where contests are held after the deadline date, the school may submit an entry based on a probable Division I. Should the band not earn a Division I, fees will be returned.

 Fourteen copies of the marching band evaluation form must be prepared and filed with the State Marching Band Contest chairman. A *Form One* is not necessary, but the principal of the school must certify that all participants are eligible under the UIL general and music eligibility rules.

4. Entry fees must accompany the entry forms. 5. Each director is requested to attach to the entry form a list of the selections to be played in the order of performance. Changes in the program should be sent in writing to the contest chairman seven days prior to the contest. This information will be used by the announcer on the public address system.

FEES

1. Fees for the State Marching Band Contest are as follows:

a. Schools in conference AAAA and AAA-\$150 b. Schools in conferences AA and A-\$125
 c. Schools in conference B-\$100

 Excess fees, after expenses have been met, will be rebated to participating schools on a prorata basis.

 All checks should be made payable to the University Interscholastic League. Mail entries and fees to: State Marching Band Contest, UIL, Box 8028, Austin, Texas 78712. Fees are not refundable after deadline date.

SCHEDULE

 The State Marching Band Contest chairman will determine the order of performances in each conference.

 Bands from conferences AAAA, A and B will perform on the first day and evening of the contest.

 Bands from conferences AAA and AA will perform on the second day and evening of the contest.

 The performance time limits for bands at the State Marching Band Contest are the same as those for region contests.

ADJUDICATION PLAN

I. On the day of the contest a preliminary contest will be held to select the five highest scoring bands from each conference to perform in the finals held in the evening of the contest date.

 Bands will be rated according to the division rating system and a numerical plan. Division ratings will be assigned according to the following numerical scores:

Division 1-90-100 points

Division II-80-89.9 points

- Division III-70-79.9 points Division IV-60-69.9 points
- Division V-50-59.9 points

4. The final performance will be scored independently of the preliminary performance. Those bands participating in the final contest may receive two ratings: the preliminary rating and the final rating. Only the final rating will be used to determine the winner and awards for those receiving two ratings.

If five or fewer bands from the same conference enter the contest, all five will be certified for the final performance and only the final rating will be given.

AWARD5

Example

 Bands receiving a numerical rating of 90-100 points in either the preliminary contest or the final contest will receive a Division I State Marching Band Plaque.

 State Marching Band Trophies will be awarded to the three bands in each conference receiving the highest numerical score in the final contest. A band may receive only the highest award earned.

CONDUCT

Band members and directors are expected to follow the rules and procedures outlined for all UIL Music Contests and those instructions provided by the Contest Chairman for the State Marching Band Contest. Failure to follow all regulations may result in disqualification.

Pearsall High School marching band has another great year

The perennial all-state Pearsall High School marching band has had another year of stellar accomplishments. Though the 1993-94 school year is the "off year" for 3A state band UIL competition, the Pearsall Band has been anything but inactive.

The band is under the leadership of Daniel Aleman, who has directed it for the past 20 years. The reputation of Pearsall ISD is well known among bands, districts and musicians throughout Texas and in neighboring states. When students from Pearsall transfer to other districts, they often report that they are immediately asked about the Pearsall band.

The high school bands are codirected by Eduardo Aleman. Rocky Harris and Greg Bonamase are two other band instructors who also assist with all of the levels of band direction at the High School and Junior High.

This year, the band won the UIL Sweepstakes Award by receiving Superior Ratings in Marching, Concert, and Sight Reading. In addition, the band placed more students on the All-Region Band than any other school (1A-4A) in the entire region.

The band also placed second runner-up at the Marching Bands of America Regional Finals in Houston. This competition involves the very best marching bands from many different states.

All of the high school and junior high bands received a Superior rat-

ing at their UIL Sight Reading contests. In addition to the awards received by the high school band, the junior high band placed more students on the Junior High All-Region Band than any other school. The band is under the direction of Rocky Harris.

At a recent Pearsall ISD employee appreciation banquet, it was noted that the staff at the band hall has the best employee attendence record of any one group or office of people in the district. This particular distinction helps explain the constant excellence achieved by the band.

The Pearsall bands have a reputation for continually utilizing the most difficult and challenging music and routines. It is commonplace for the band to choose from the most difficult material set aside for larger district bands.

Though the band is 3A in size, the Pearsall band is prestigious enough in the community to attract a very large number of students. Also contributing to the success of the band is the large and very active Band Boosters Club. That club has helped defray expenses through various donations and has raised money to keep the band functioning at a high level. Typically, the band boosters are quietly working behind the scenes at football games (selling concessions) in order to keep the band on the field at halftime.

Superintendent Kelly noted that "The Pearsall band provides the finest district example of group academic accomplishment, year in and year out. The band directors and students are not satisfied with anything short of statewide excellence and accomplishment. Each year, the band works to be better than before and to recognize, rehearse and reward music talent in greater depth and at earlier grade levels. The teachers work together as a team to develop a spirit of unity and cohesiveness that is second-to-none. The rest of our district does well to follow their example."



The Pearsall bands completed an extremely busy week of evaluations this past week. Three high school bands and two junior high bands all went to their UIL concert A-2 Sight Reading "contest" on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. This UIL "contest" is not really a competitive contest as such. This is an annual evaluation held under the auspice of the UIL. While the TAAS tests are a relatively new phenomenom, their UIL band evaluations of concert, performance, and sight reading and music reading skills have been going on for some 30 or 40 years.

Again this year our Pearsall bands have shown themselves to be in excellent musical health and "at or above" grade level in their reading skills. All five bands received a division I, superior, rating from each of the judges, that heard them perform their sight reading.

Mr. Daniel Aleman said, "I feel extremely proud of all our bands because they are a reflection of the entire band program here at Pearsall. Alot more people are able to see and hear our Pearsall High School Marching Band during football season and are aware of the high quality of work that they do. During concert season our high school band breaks up into three concert bands and also does outstanding work during this season. No other 3A school in our Region has a second band, and here in Pearsall we have three bands, and our third band received a I on concert and a I in sight reading! We may very well have the only 3A third band in state. Our junior high second group is the only junior high second group in our region from 3A schools. Overall, even though each band did not receive a top rating at everything, our entire program did extremely well."

High school bands compete at John Jay in concert, sightreading

Two sweepstakes trophies ...

Students in high school bands from across South Texas converged on John Jay High School in San Antonio last week for their annual University Interscholastic League Concert & Sightreading Contest and returned with the coveted Sweepstakes trophies for Pearsall and Dilley.

The contest on Wednesday, April 17 included performances by the high school bands of concert pieces they had rehearsed this semester, followed by performances of pieces they were given in the sighreading auditorium and were required to play with no practice and with less

than ten minutes' prior instruction from their band directors.

Three Pearsall High School bands competed in the event, the first group being the Maverick Band, which earned Division I ratings in both the concert and sightreading portions of the contest for the Sweepstakes trophy. The group performed National Emblem March by Bagley, Grace Praehudium by McBeth and directed by Daniel Aleman. The Sweenstakes trophy is

given by the UIL organization to bands which have earned Division I ratings from judges at the marching contest in the fall and the concert and sightreading con-sightreading. tests in the spring.

Pearsall's second group to perform was directed by Edward Aleman and earned a Division I rating on the concert stage and a Division II rating in the sightreading auditorium. The group performed The Klasson Manch by Fillmore, Fanture Variations by Barker and Three Folk Minianames by Jutras.

The PHS bands' third group at the contest was directed by Chester by Schumann and was Lura Stevens and Adan Salinas and performed Ringmaster Concert March by Burden, Caprice by Hines and Crest of Nobility by Sheldon. Judges awarded the group a Division II on the concert stage and a Division III rating in

form of this difficulty. The Pearsall band is the only AAA band in Region XI to have three performing concert bands.

The Pearsall third band played selections familiar to the other schools' second bands and their march by a AAA first band. The third band earned an excellent (II) rating in both Concert and Sightreading.

Pearsall's second band performed a program that would equal the UIL requirement for a AAAA first band. Only two other first groups in the region attempted this type of program. Pearsall's second band received an excellent (II) rating in Concert and a superior (I) rating in Sightreading.

The Pearsall first band's program consisted of La Inglesina by D. Delle Case, Overture to Candide by Leonard Bernstein and Variations of 'America' by Charles Ives. The two selections from the UIL contest list are on the grade 5 list. The program exceeds the requirements of a class AAAAA high school. Pearsall's top band received superior (I) ratings from all six judges in Concert and Sightreading.

This year's Sightreading selection was the most difficult arrangement for Sightreading in many years. Several bands failed to make the top rating in either Concert or Sightreading or both. With the marching band's performance in the fall, there were three sweepstakes awards this year: South San Antonio West Campus, Carrizo Springs and Pearsall.

Pearsall Bands in U.I.L. Contest

PEARSALL - The Pearsall bands, at both the Junior High and High School participated this past week at U.I.L. Concert and Sight Reading.

This U.I.L event is often referred to as a contest but is actually only an evaluation. The performance is an observation by three highly qualified band directors who will evaluate each band's performance of music chosen from a pre-graded list of music. Within each list there are about 70 selections to choose from and bands are always allowed to choose music from lists that are above those prescribed for their size school.

"Here in Pcarsall we use these evaluations at "contest" to receive criticism that will help us improve our teaching. We challenge our students at all levels with the most technically and numerically demanding music within their grasp and hope that

our "judges" will be able to explain to us how to improve the program. We do not always get a "First Division" rating but our bands are always very impressive, and we all learn from the challenge and the evaluation.

On Tuesday, the two Pearsall Jr. High bands traveled to Boerne for their concert and sight reading "Contest". Mr. Galvez's "B" Band received a II on concert and a 1 in sight reading (Pearsall is the only 3A school that has a 2nd Jr. High band). Mr. Harris's "A" Band received a III on concert and a I in sight reading (this is the first year the "A" Band played two selections from the grade three prescribed list even though the U.I.L expects them to play from the grade one list).

On Wednesday and Thursday the two High School bands went to contest at Marshall High School in San Antonio. Mr. Edward Aleman's H.S. 2nd group received a 1 in concert and a 1 in sight reading (Pearsall is the only 3A school that has a H.S. second group and this group played music such as difficult as most 3A schools). Mr. Daniel Aleman's H.S. Ist group also received a 1 in concert and 1 in sight reading.

"We are very proud of the performances of each of the groups. The program that each group presented were a tremendous challenge. We can point with pride at the fact that each group received a 1 Division, superior rating, on their sight reading abilities. Their superior results in their category demonstrates that all of our music students are reading at, or above, their grade level."

All these bands, as well as the beginner's band, are presently preparing their programs for the Pearsall Bands End of the Year concerts coming up in May.

Pearsall bands given evaluation

The Pearsall High School and Junior High Bands went to their Concert and Sight Reading evaluation. The High School band travled to San Antonio Wednesday, April 15, and the Junior High Band travled to Bandera Thursday, April 16.

This is an evaluation where the bands were judged on how well they perform their chosen musical selections. This is not a contest where one band's performance is judged and compared to another's. At the concert portion of the evaluation, the bands had to choose from a UIL list of music prescribed for the bands according to school classification. The Pearsall bands have consistently been able to perform music that is more difficult than what the UIL prescribes and still perform well enough to rate high evaluation scores from the three judges.

The Pearsall High School first group performed music prescribed for 5A schools and received a First Division (Superior) rating. The High School second band performed music prescribed for 4A schools and recieved a Second Division (Excellent) rating. The PJH "A" Band performed music prescribed for 3A high schools and recieved a First Division (Superior) rating. The PJH "B" Band received a Second Division (Excellent) rating.

In the Sight Reading portion of these evaluations the band is required to perform a selected piece of music after only 7-8 minutes of instructions by their director. The perfomance was evaluated by three judges.

The PJH "B" Band recieved a Second Division (Excellent), PJH "A" Band recieved a First Division (Superior) rating. The PHS first and second group both recieved First Division (Superior) ratings.

Mr Aleman said "We try to choose, for each band, music that is technically and musically as challenging as they can possibly perform. We try to choose the music that is worthy of 4 or 5 weeks of rehersals. The music we select for our bands should be a summation of all the particular band has been working on and will be able to handle in a piece of music. I, as well as all of my directors, are extremely proud of the accomplishments and performance of each group. We look forward to performing these selections for parents and the general public very soon at our end- . of-the-year concert.

My goal was to try to get each band of our program accustomed to striving for, and achieving more than the minimum requirement.

High School Band Wins Honors At Dallas Contest

The Pearsall High School Band traveled to Dallas this past weekend to participate in an invitational concert contest associated with the Six Flags amusement park. At this contest which has bands from all across the state and including some out of state bands, the Pearsall High School first band was selected as the best of all the bands competing in Class 3A. The Pearsall High School second band which competes against all bands in class 2A was selected as the 1st runner-up winner.

Band Director Daniel Aleman stated "This is the first time our Pearsall band has ever won at a Six-Flags contest and to make our ac-



PHRYGIANA James Andrews

Phrygiana takes its name from its modality and incorporates techniques and devices to intrigue the amateur as well as the professional musicologist. It is very interesting for the performer and stays with the listener, melodically and rhythmically. Mr. Andrews recently left teaching for private business. He continues to compose and arrange, offering clinic services through his newly organized ComposerResources in Round Rock, Texas.

First Movement

Few contemporary American composers of the first rank have shown more active interest in music for Wind and Percussion instruments. In addition to his compositions for Band and Orchestra he has written extensively for solo winds and chamber groups. The Concertino for Marimba and Band, written in 1940 has become one of the major works for percussionists.

Roland Muzquiz, our soloist, is a 1976 graduate of Pearsall High School, three years an All State Percussionist. Roland was also percussionist with the San Antonio Youth Symphony, studying with Dean Witten. Since graduating from the Eastman School of Music in 1980 he has been employed as special instructor with the Richardson Band Program.

GRACE PRAELUDIUM Francis McBeth

We are all familiar with Dr. W. Francis McBeth and his contribution to the repertoire of contemporary bands. His intense interest in the wind symphony has been a shaping force in its literature. From the time Martin Luther's "Mighty Fortress" served as inspiration for Bach's "Reformation Sunday Cantata" to the present, hymn music has proved fertile idea ground for composers. 'Grace Praeludium' is a most welcome addition to band literature.

GUADALAJARA Pepe Guizar "Jalisco Tiene Su Novia, gu es Guadalajara." The poets call the city of Guadalajara the "Pearl of the Occident" because of its beauty, flower filled parks and plazas and colonial architecture. This city invented the Mariachi to provide music for its celebrations and fiestas. This arrangement by Victor Williams captures the spirit of that colorful city.

This concert makes the fourteenth occasion for us to be closely associated with a group chosen for State Honors by TMEA. This is a particularly happy occasion for us. Dan represented Reitz Music Company for several years. In addition, Edward and Barbara taught privately for us as under graduates.


NEW BAND HALL

The new Pearsall Band Hall was accepted by Board President Sue Shelton on January 17, 1990.

The Pearsall Band Hall consists of approximately 9,000 square feet of floor area and 2,200 square feet of storage The building contains a area. 3,900 square foot concert hall as well as a 1,500 square foot ensemble area. These three rooms are lined with acoustical wall panels and are designed for proper sound by Boner Associates, Inc. of Austin. There are also sound booths provided for individual use. The balance of the facility is comprised of offices, a music library, instrument storage, storage areas, and restrooms.

The project was completed by Galen May Architectural Associates and K \leq K Construction at a total cost of \$400,450.

An Open House is being planned for February 25, 1990 from 2:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. The public is cordially invited.



When I got to Pearsall in '73, the high school "band hall" was a stage that opened into a gymnasium, and the curtain between them did not always work. Later, when we split the HS band into two bands, the top band (fewer) would meet at the Jr Hi band hall (which was the original band hall ever) which leaked when it rained and always smelled like it. This new band hall was what I had put together from looking at the blueprints from the Alice and Georgetown band halls.

The board after publicly reading several policies from other school districts, referring to not naming facilities due to political pressure, temporary popularity or favoritism voted to name the new band hall the Pearsall Band Hall, with a recommendation to put a plaque inside recognizing band director Dan Aleman's and his staff's accomplishments.







Aleman is nominated for Texas Teacher of the Year

Daniel Aleman, Pearsall I.S.D. Band Director, was recently nominated by the Pearsall School District for the Texas Teacher of the Year Award. Aleman has spent the last 22 years as director of one of the most successful band programs in the State of Texas. His students have earned the highest possible honors available to Texas students; among them Best Marching Band in the state; TMEA Honor Band; and individual student membership on the Texas All-State Band.

The Texas State Teacher of the Year Award is jointly sponsored by the Texas Education Agency, the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Jostens Learning Corporation and a number of major educational associations. Winners will be selected at the Regional and State level with finalists being selected in October 1995.

The criteria for the award consists partly of an evaluation of the teacher's concern for students and capability to inspire them; the ability and willingness of the teacher to work cooperatively with colleagues; a drive to initiate activities that improve instruction for students; and an ability and willingness to make meaningful contributions to education.

Aleman's professional career as Pearsall Band Director has spanned over two decades. As many as onethird of eligible high school students are routinely enrolled in the band program. The depth of student involvement can be best illustrated by the number of students in the Pearsall 3rd Level band who have won district and regional honors. As an indication of the constant excellence of the band program over time, it is significant to note that Aleman's bands have received superior ratings in all but two of the 69 UIL contests in which his bands have participated.

Aleman received a Bachelor's of Music Education from Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas, in 1966. He received 36 hours of graduate education in Spanish Literature from the University of Mexico City during 1972. Aleman spent several years as a representative for a music company prior to his role with Pearsall. That experience allowed him to visit a large number of band programs in the state, including Pearsall's. He returned from Mexico in 1973 and began his long association here after the previous band director nominated him for the job.

Aleman and his assistant band directors are renowned for work with all levels of students. He has worked to ensure that his program nurtures the growth of student musicians from grades 6 through 12. One of his student band members recently returned from participation in the All-State Band and reported that others were amazed to hear that she had received her instruction from the band directors at her high school, rather than in private lessons as most elite state caliber musicians do.

Superintendent John Kelly noted that "Daniel has brought academic excellence, perseverance, intellectual rigor, and a great sense of pride to Pearsall. He is an outstanding candidate for this great honor and it is our sincere hope that the rest of the state will have the opportunity to acknowledge his contribution by having him selected as the Texas Teacher of the Year."





I am writing to you with a very important request. As seems to be the case at different levels everywhere, I am somewhat fighting a battle here at Frenship. I have a supportive administration and community that I feel only needs a bit of education. Unfortunately, the expert opinions they will listen to really needs to come from another direction than my own. Therefore I am soliciting some documentation from highly respected music educators like yourself to use as my argument.

Currently there is no allowance for band grades to be used in the class ranking system here at Frenship. I am trying to not only get the grades included in that system, but have an honors track as well.

This policy exists because of a higher problem. The overall thinking in my district is that band, music and even the fine arts are just for fun and there is no serious long-term benefits from this class. I am in the process of drafting a letter to my entire band program grades 6 - 12 and the entire fifth grade class. I have included various excerpts from some of the Southwestern Musician articles and intend to use quotes and entire letters from people like yourself. I will pass along this information to every level of my administration and quite possibly the teaching staff for the entire school district. My goal is to educate as many people in my district as possible about what music can do for their total development.

If at all possible, please send the following as soon as you can. If for some reason you are not comfortable in doing this or do not have the time, that is OK. I do appreciate your consideration and time.

- Personal letter on your stationary reflecting your personal convictions on music and its impact on the total development of a child.
- Any pertinent materials that illustrate your school district's policies regarding class ranking and how fine arts are included in that determination. Please include any honor credit opportunities and any weighted grade considerations.
