SWEEPS UP SWEEPSTAKES IN KILGORE

The Hallsville Band journeyed to Kilgore Tuesday April 18, where they received their second consecutive sweepstakes award..this award requires a First Division rating in U. I. L. Contests of Marching, Sightreading and Concert. Early next morning the band left for Pensacola, Florida to compete in the Festival of Five Flags Band Contest which consists of three parade contests, a marching contest, and competition in these events for best drum major and majorette line.

In these contests the band won ten out of a possible thirteen trophies for outstanding performance. The outstanding drum major award was won in all three parades by Hallsville's Miss Beth Daily. The outstanding majorette line award was given to the Hallsville majorette line in two of the three parades. The majorettes are Denise Bufkin, Kathleen Cole, Teresa Burks, Nannette McFarland, Karla Berry and Gail Rosette. The Band won in all three parades and the marching contest.

Mr. Gerald Fagan, Band Director, said, "This is the most musically and technically proficient group that has ever represented the Hallsville School. This is an energetic and hardworking group of boys and girls with great pride and a desire to win that is second to none."

The last night of competition was topped off by the naming of the Hallsville Band as the official Festival of Five Flags Band and the presentation of the trophy for the most outstanding band of the entire competition.

The contest drew approximately 20 outstanding bands from across the Southern United States, from Lindale, Mineola and Gladewater, Texas; from Lexington, Kentucky, Trussville, Alabama, Franklin, Kentucky, Rutherford, North Carolina and Dublin, Georgia.


The Center Roughrider band received first division ratings from three separate judges at the University Interscholastic League marching contest held Thursday, November 15, at Hallsville, Texas.



Rusk High Band Wins Sweepstakes

The Rusk High School Band received the UIL "Sweepstakes" award during the UIL Playing and Sightreading Contest Mar. 11 in Tyler. "This is the highest honor a band can receive in UIL band competition," says Gerald Fagan, band director. "As far as we know this is the first time this has happened to the RHS band in the history of the school."

The "Sweepstakes" award is awarded to bands which receive a first division in all UIL contests which include marching concert and sightreading.

The RHS band competed in the AA Division with about 20 other bands. Only Rusk and Lindale received the "Sweepstakes" award in the AA Division.

Fagan directs the 80 member band.

RHS Band Wins

The Rusk High School band received its second consecutive Sweepstakes award in regional University Interscholastic League competition last week.

The band earned the award during U.I.L. competition at Nacogdoches High School Wednesday. This is the second year in a row that the band has earned this award.

To win the Sweepstakes Award, a band must receive a superior first division rating in the three major U.I.L. contests-marching, concert and sight reading.

The judges for the contest were Bob Ingram of Texarkana High School, Sammy Albany of Longview and Bob Renfroe of Texas City. Among the comments about the band from the judges were "very fine, expressive band," "band shows much pride," "excellent clarity of tone," "very sensitive performance," "tastefully played," and "well trained group."

Band director Gerald Fagan said that he is very proud of the band students and appreciates the hard work and time sacrificed by the students in the endeavor.

He extended a special thank you to the parents of the band members for their time, effort and support. Fagan also said that the school, administration and community are also appreciated.





THE BAND IS UNDER THE DIRECTION OF GERALD FEAGAN AND ASSISTANT DIRECTOR MIKE MCGOWAN.






