School Band. During his two year tenure there, the band received its first of two Sweepstakes awards. The opportunity to move to the Class AAAAA Texarkana ISD to become Supervisor of the Instrumental Music Program and to direct the Texas High School Marching, Concert and Jazz Bands came in 1964. Bob remained in this capacity until his retirement in 1992. During this time, the band received many Sweepstakes and first division ratings. The band was privileged to play for four United States Presidents: Johnson, Carter, Ford and Reagan. While in Texarkana, Bob served as President of the Four States Bandmasters Association and was very active in community affairs including serving as President of the Lions Club. He was a charter member of TMAA and enjoyed judging in Texas and the Southwest. One of the greatest highlights of his career was serving on the Board of Directors of the Texas Bandmasters Association where he was the President in 1974-75.



Eddie Galvan

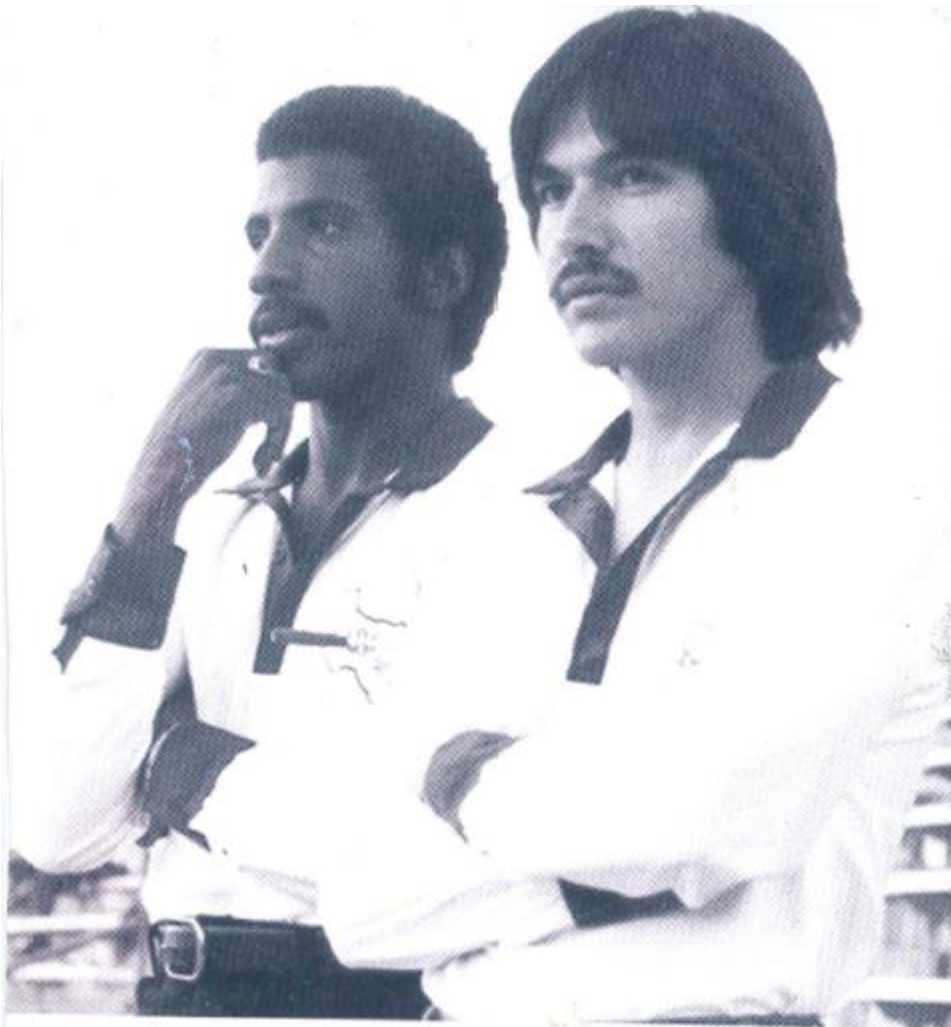

Eddie Galvan earned an Associate of Arts degree from Del Mar College in Corpus Christi and received his Bachelor of Music degree from Texas A & I University in Kingsville, Texas in 1952. His Master of Science degree in Music Education in 1953 was also from Texas A & I. He has done post graduate work at the University of Houston. Eddie's first teaching job was as an Assistant Band Director at Premont High School, Premont, Texas in 1953. He moved to Refugio High School as Assistant Band and Choral Director in 1954. He was the Band Director at Driscoll Junior High School in Corpus Christi for six years, and then he moved to Roy Miller High School in 1962 where he directed the band for ten years. Eddie served in different administrative capacities in the Corpus Christi ISD from 1972-1985. In 1985, he became Assistant Professor of Music at Corpus Christi State University. Eddie's bands were consistent UIL Sweepstakes winners. They received Outstanding Band awards at Six Flags Over Texas and the Buccaneer Days Festival. They also made a 1968 guest appearance at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas. Eddie was a member of Phi Beta Mu, TMEA, TBA, and TMAA. He was a guest clinician and performer at many jazz festivals as well as an adjudicator throughout the state of Texas.

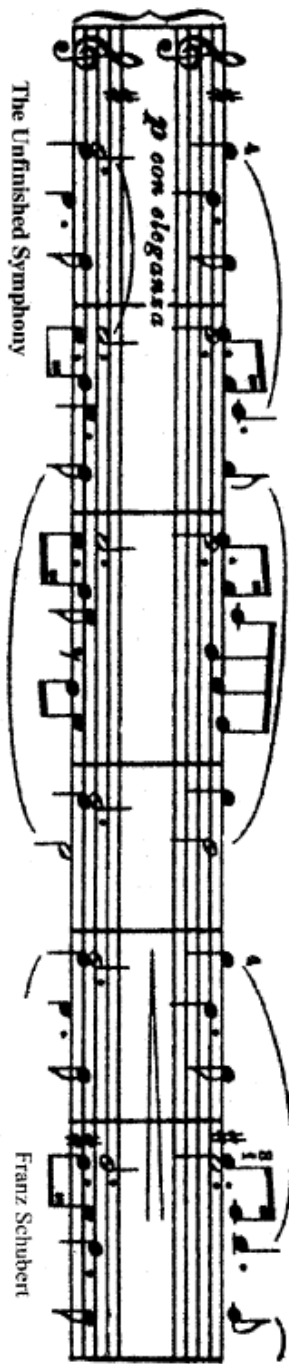

25 Years of Service to the LBJ High School Jaguar Band



Don T. Haynes, Jr.

Don T. Haynes, Jr., Director of Bands at LBJ High School, began his music career at the age of 6, tutored by his father, who was band director at Coles High School in Corpus Christi, and his mother, who studied voice at both the Julliard School in New York and The University of Texas. As a child, he studied trumpet, French horn, piano, violin, cello, flute, voice, and clarinet. After two years of study at the Del Mar College of Music in Corpus Christi, he transferred to The University of Texas, where he earned a bachelor's degree in music in 1973 and was a member of the Longhorn Marching Band. In 1978, he completed a master's degree at UT, specializing in instrumental music and conducting. He was the Assistant Band Director at Anderson High School for two years before being named Director at LBJ High School in August 1975.

Mr. Haynes was awarded the prestigious, statewide **Denius Award** in 1994, presented to Texas' top University Interscholastic League (UIL) sponsors. At LBJ High School, his colleagues have selected him **Teacher of the Year** four times, most recently in 1998-99. He is an invited conductor/clinician for region bands and summer music camps throughout Texas, and has served as guest conductor for all-region Bands in New Mexico and Florida. An active UIL adjudicator for concert and marching bands at all levels, Mr. Haynes has held offices in the Texas Music Educators Association and has served on the TMEA Advisory Board and on the UIL State Sightreading Advisory Committee. He is a member of Phi Beta Mu, Texas Bandmasters Association, and Texas Music Educators Association.

Under his leadership, the Jaguar Band's awards and accomplishments are numerous—representing the United States in 1996 in the New Year's Day Parade in London; playing concerts in England and touring France in 2000; earning first-place honors at the Fiesta Bowl Competition in 1978; earning first- or second-place honors in band festivals in Texas, Florida, Oklahoma, California, and Colorado; receiving consistent Division I and Sweepstakes honors at UIL marching and concert performances; and being the first band since 1987 to win the opportunity to represent Austin in the State UIL Marching Competition in 1997, competing as a finalist in the State 4-A marching competition.

More than a decade ago, Don Haynes had a vision for a band festival. His dream became reality in 1993 when the Capital City Marching Festival (CCMF) was born as a joint project of the band parent groups at Crockett High School and LBJ High School. The CCMF philosophy is that all high school bands deserve support and opportunities to showcase their talents. Each year bands come from all over Texas to participate in this pre-UIL event that builds student confidence and fosters band unity. The Capital City Marching Festival is now one of the premiere UIL-prep festivals in the state.

Mr. Haynes is also an official for high school and women's college basketball. He has been selected to officiate at the UIL Girls State Basketball tournaments in Austin.

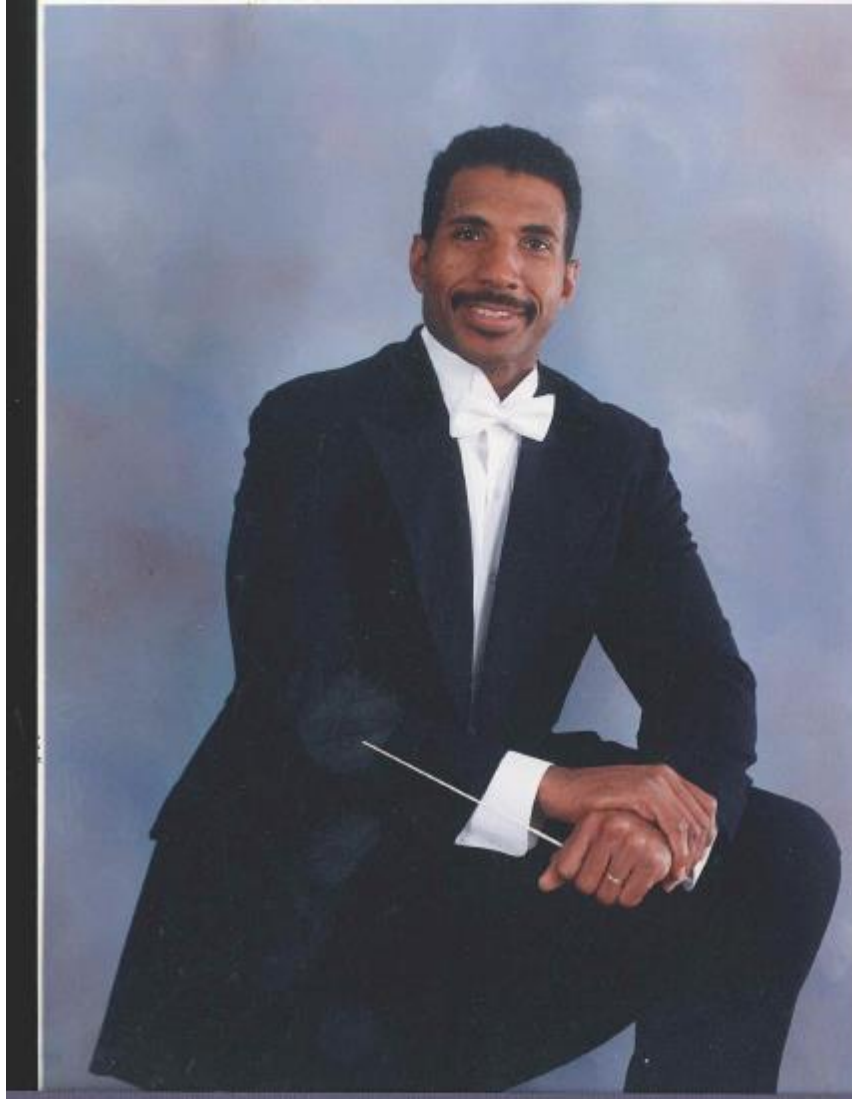

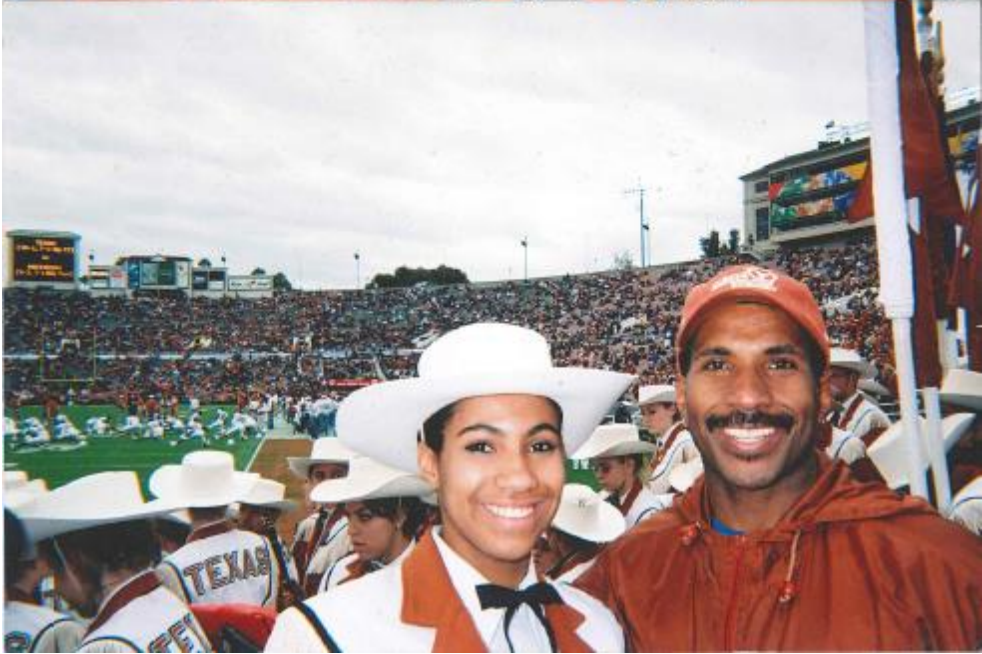

Enjoy the traditions, friendships, concerts, exhibits, and terrific clinics—all surrounded by a warm family atmosphere. Welcome to TBA!

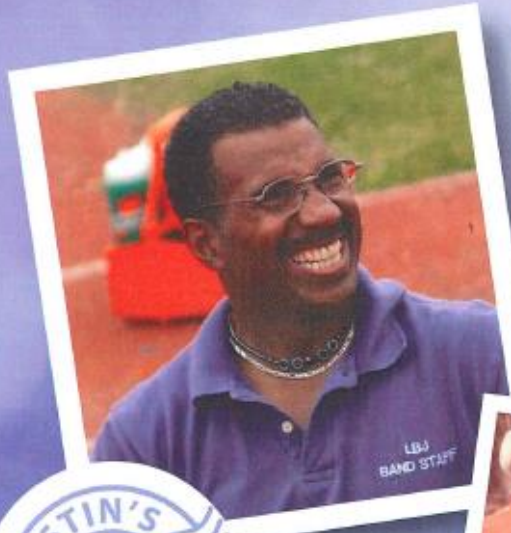
