





Band Contest 2008

Stratford's Big Blue Band competed in UIL Concert and Sightreading at Boys Ranch on April 17th. Under the direction of Randy Hunsaker, the band performed <u>Midway March, Blue Ridge Saga</u>, and <u>They Led My Lord Away</u>. The band was judged in three main areas: tone, technique, and musicianship. All three concert judges gave Stratford a final rating of "I". Some of the comments from the critique sheets are "Holy Smokes! What a great band – really fine playing from everyone," and "Beautiful Job!!!"

Stratford also received straight ones in Sightreading. The judges gave enthusiastic comments on the band's abilities in this area as well. "This is a great band with a great tradition. I look forward to seeing you again in 1A." "This was a truly fine performance."

While several sections of the band were specifically praised for their expertise, the one most important factor was that they produced "solid ensemble sounds." The judges were most impressed by how well they all worked together.

All of the judges gave high praises but there was one that summed it up the best by saying, "It is obvious that a lot of great teaching and learning is going on. You have yourselves and your fine band director to thank for this accomplishment. Be sure you do so!!"
