Dwight Tomb, 66, died Thursday at his home.

Graveside services will be at 11 a.m. Saturday at Elmwood Memorial Park with the Rev. James Blagg and Dr. Ed Lang officiating, directed by North's Funeral Home, 242 Orange.

Born in Claude, he was reared in Clarendon and Sweetwater. He received a bachelor of music degree in 1951 from Hardin-Simmons University where he was a member of Cowboy Band.

He received his master's degree in music from the University of Houston. He taught band at Anson, Wylie, El Paso, Bronte, Edinburg, Mission, Sweetwater, Clyde, San Angelo and Colorado City schools. He had also taught at Ranger Junior College and Midwestern University.

He retired in 1985. He was a member of Association of Rudimental Drummers, All Saints Episcopal Church in Colorado City, Texas Bandmasters Association and the Texas Music Educators Association. He was a veteran of World War II.

Survivors include his mother, Zell Tomb of Abilene; a son, John Tomb of Oakland, Calif.; three daughters, Margo Gary of Arlington, Erin Tomb and Elise Tomb, both of Brazoria; a sister, Charlotte Bettis of Abilene; one grandson; and one niece.
