



Refreshments of cake and coo-kies with frosted lime punch were served to hundred or more peo-


For entertainment there was dancing to recordings and many impromptu numbers in song, trup-Smith played "Beautiful pet, violin, and electric guitars.









## New Lanier Dean Knows Street

The new dean at Lanier High School is no stranger to the barrio.

John C. Rodriguez, the school's bandmaster, who was promoted this year to dean, was born a few blocks from Lanier.

He was born to Mr. and Mrs. Juan Rodriguez at 817 S. Frio in 1927.

Rodriguez, who was appointed bandmaster in 1964 by the late Fidel Tafolla, was a student at the old Navarro Elementary Sc. Pecos.

He recalls that when sister, Gloria, was six and five years old their paren taking them to their uncle vate cello and violin less uncle, Rodriguez said, play with the San Antonio Symp chestra.




