ANTHEM FROM AMERICA Ernest Bloch

Commissioned by the J. C. Penney Company to commemorate the Bicentennial Year. It is one of several in the Bicentennial Musical Celebration collection which was a gift from that company to the schools of Brownsville.

OVERTURE TO "CANDIDE" Leonard Bernstein

This Broadway musical play was based on the original written by the writer-philosopher Voltaire, who in 1758 wrote it as a wickedly joyful satire. Mr. Bernstein, who was the first American-born to obtain the prestigious post of Music Director of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, has also contributed other works to our American music horizons: On the Town, Wonderful Town, and West Side Story. Recently, he also wrote "Mass" to dedicate the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D. C.

AMERICAN SUITE Wilford L. Holcombe

1. *Westward Ho:* This movement depicts American pioneers in simple covered wagons pushing across the Great Plains in their courageous pursuit of a new future.
2. *Morning:* This section reveals to the listener the simple beauty of the gradual dawning of a new day and the spectacle of a new and hopeful land.
3. *Celebration:* A series of jaunty dance tunes sets the mood of this jovial movement. One can see the American pioneers dancing in a vigorous, colorful folk ballet.

YANKEE DOODLE Morton Gould

With his light-hearted and at times humorous approach, Mr. Gould gives us his version of this well-known Colonial Period tune.

GEORGE GERSHWIN: A Symphonic Portrait . . . arr. Bruce Chase

With his brother Ira invisibly by his side, this symphonic portrait presents a capsule image of the later Gershwin in sound. From that original "folk opera", "Porgy and Bess", three excerpts give a sampling of his genius: the naive lullaby Summertime, the passionate duet Bess, You Is My Woman, and It Ain't Necessarily So, a rollicking revival song. Sprinkled between these are the popular ballads They Can't Take That Away From Me, Love Is Here to Stay, and A Foggy Day.

TRIBUTE TO ARMSTRONG arr. John Edmondson

In this tribute to old "Satchmo", who was one of many Black Americans who contributed to the only truly American form of music, jazz, we hear some old favorites: Basin Street, High Society, Mame, Hello Dolly, and the traditional Dixieland tune When the Saints Go Marching In.

This work is a combination of two separate forms: first, a beautiful chorale utilizing a rich chordal structure; and second, a fugue in the style of Bach.

MEDLEY: MICHELLE—ELEANOR RIGBY—YESTERDAY
Lennon, McCartney; Arr. Andrew Balent
A fine arrangement of three classic Beatle tunes for symphonic band changes the program to a lighter note.

A FESTIVAL PRELUDE Alfred Reed
"A Festival Prelude" was written in commemoration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Tri-State Music Festival, held annually in Enid, Oklahoma. This work has come to be regarded as one of this composer's most brilliant and powerful works for the modern concert band.

PROGRAM

PRELUDE to ACT III from "LOHENGRIN" Richard Wagner
In the opera "Lohengrin," this brief and brilliant prelude is played before the curtain goes up on Act III, wherein Lohengrin, Knight of the Holy Grail, is married to Elsa.

SKETCHES ON A TUDOR PSALM Fisher Tull
Composed in 1971, this work is based on a sixteenth century setting of the Second Psalm by Thomas Tallis. A modern adaptation is still used today in Anglican services. Its popularity is evidenced by its employment by Ralph Vaughan Williams as the basis for his Fantasia for Strings in 1910.

MARCH from "SYMPHONIC METAMORPHOSIS" Paul Hindemith
Based on themes by Carl Maria von Weber.

THE TYPEWRITER Leroy Anderson
Leroy Anderson's music reflects not only his busy and varied background but his own personality. His wry Yankee wit is an integral element in his music. From some of the taken-for-granted everyday sounds, such as the clacking of a typewriter, Mr. Anderson comes up with an amusing and delightful musical vignette.

Pharr Brothers Enhance Popularity Of Brownsville Band in Mexico

BROWNSVILLE — Three are several reasons the Brownsville High School Golden Eagle Band is so popular in Mexico but the two principal ones are Art and Segundo Guajardo from Pharr. The Guajardo brothers are members of the band staff at the high school. Art has been teaching music at the school for 11 years and Segundo for more than five.

Since there is a real scarcity of printed arrangements of Mexican folk music in Mexico, few bands in the U.S. can play Mexican folk music the same as the Golden Eagle Band. Other school and college bands lack the familiarity and feeling for such music and without sheet music they can't compete with the Golden Eagle organization.

In addition, they do not have the Guajardo brothers to write arrangements of folk music for them. In a recent appearance, the University of Oklahoma Band had to borrow Art Guajardo's arrangement of

"Guadalajara."

With a strong library of arrangements of many Mexican folk tunes, the Golden Eagle Band is called on frequently to appear at outstanding events and festivals all over Mexico.

Today they will make their fourth appearance at the Tamaulipas State Fair in Ciudad Victoria as guests of Governor Manuel Ravlze. Guillermo Santillana sub-delegate of tourism in Matamoros will handle border crossing arrangements for the trip.

The band will leave Brownsville at 8 a.m. today aboard four buses provided by the State of Tamaulipas through Sub-Delegado de Turismo in Tamaulipas, Gilberto Garcia of Cd. Victoria, who is coordinator of arrangements for the band in the state capitol.

Garcia said the band is expected to arrive in Cd. Victoria at 1 p.m.

The parade will form at 5 p.m. in the main plaza of the

city and march to the Governor's Palace where the band will be greeted by state officials. The band will be presented in concert at 7 tonight at the Teatro del Pueblo in the Tamaulipas State Fair grounds and will be guests of fair officials at a dinner after the concert.

Members of the Brownsville Chamber of Commerce's International Committee, headed by Al Cisneros, and of the Brownsville IGNC Chapter, will charter special buses for the trip to the capitol, Ygnacio Garza, Jr., President of the IGNC in Brownsville said. The bus caravan will depart from the Chamber of Commerce Building at 9 a.m. today and persons interested in making the trip may join the caravan even though not members of the committees, Garza said.

Today will be the final day of the Tamaulipas State Fair which opened Nov. 27. It is the 12th Annual Fair staged at Cd. Victoria.

18 Brownsville students make All-State Band

Benny Mata learned to play the cornet in fifth grade, on his brother's school horn.

"I started on cornet in fifth grade because my brother joined the band," Mata said. "He would bring his horn home and he taught me the notes."

Mata soon began a regular regimen of practice.

"I ended up playing it more than my brother," he said.

The band teacher saw that Mata had a passion for music. He made an exception and let him in the school band a year early.

The band director needed someone to play baritone.

After five years practice, Mata, a Pace High School junior, has graduated from his "battered Vietnam-war horn" to the big leagues.

Mata and 17 other student musicians from Brownsville have been named to the All-State Band.

More Brownsville students qualified for the band than any city in South Texas, from Corpus Christi to San Antonio and Laredo.

More than 140 student musicians from South Texas competed last weekend in Alice for 56 places in the All-State Band.

Brownsville's 18 winners topped all other cities. Five students from San Antonio schools made the band.

Allen Clark, head of the Brownsville Independent School District's music program, said winning a spot in Texas' All-State Band is an honor equivalent to national recognition.

"Probably the finest all-state band is the Texas Symphonic Band. The second-best is the second All-State Texas Band," Clark said.

Clark praised the school district's band directors for doing the extra work needed to compete against students who have the advantages of big-city culture.

"They have a symphony in San Antonio and private lessons and everything else," Clark said. "I'm unaware of any paid private lessons in Browns-

ville. **Nine from the Hanna Band*

"The band directors do a lot of work after hours," he said.

Erica Casanova, an oboist at Hanna High School, said her band director has also been a career adviser. Her band directors helped her decide what instrument to play, and also influenced her to study music in college.

"When I started I had no idea what the oboe was. My sisters were in band. One played clarinet and one played flute and they wanted me to play something different," Casanova said.

Casanova is studying a Mozart concertina. "I like to be able to play what I hear," she said. She wants to be a professional musician.

Mata and other student musicians said they practice before school, sometimes during lunch, and after school — as much as 4½ hours a day.

Claudia Leticia Gonzalez, a singer from Hanna's chorus, was named to the All-State Choir.

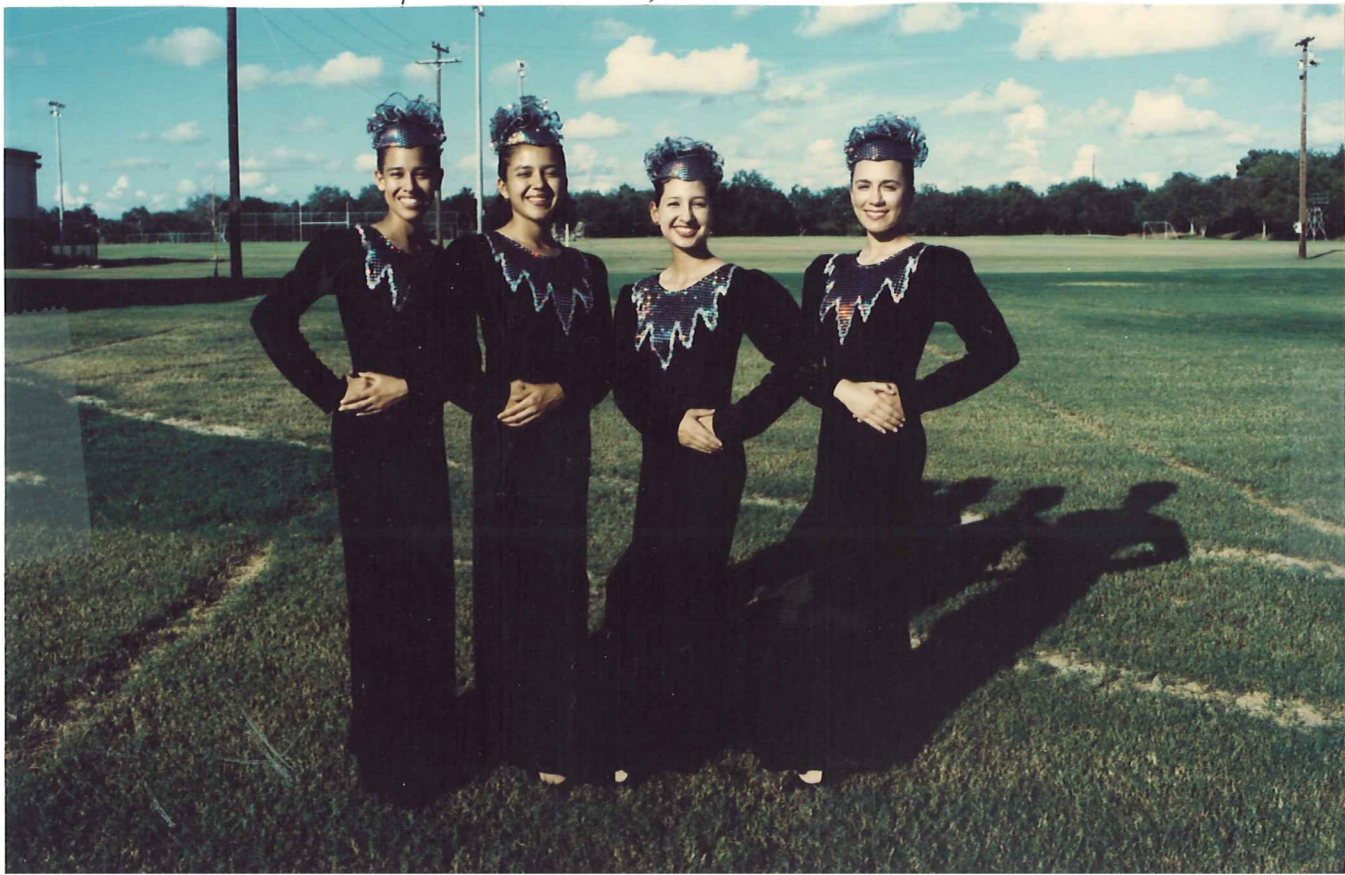

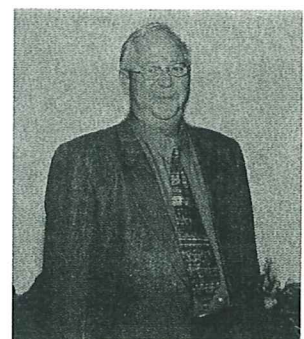

NEIGHBORS IN THE NEWS



Arcadio Guajardo Jr. has been named the recipient of the first annual Meritorious Achievement Award by the

Texas Bandmasters Association's board of directors.

He attended VanderCook College of Music from 1954-1958. In August 1958, he accepted a position as junior high school director and assistant with the Brownsville High School Band. In 1974 assumed the position of head band director at BHS, which was renamed Hanna when a new high school opened. He held that position until retirement in July 1998.

During his tenure the Hanna High School Band attained a long string of First Division ratings in the Texas University Interscholastic League Marching and Concert/Sightreading

Contests and also in the Brownsville School District Music Festival Evaluations. The Hanna Bands also earned Superior Ratings in various festivals throughout the country: Six Flags-Atlanta; Six Flags-Dallas; American Opryland Festival, Nashville; Music Maestro, Please Festivals in Chicago, Colorado Springs, Philadelphia, and Denver; American Classics Orlando; Buccaneer Days Festival Corpus Christi; and South Coast Festival, Corpus Christi.

In 1995, 1996, and 1997 the Hanna band was selected as First runner-up for Best In 5A Class at Buccaneer Days Festival and South Coast Festivals. The Hanna Bands also represented their region at the Texas Music Educators Association Honor Band Finals numerous times and in

1988 was ranked in the Top Five for that event.
