As the Eagles prepare for their appearance in the 1994 Tournament of



Through his love of music, and a very long workday, he encourages his students to deepen their musical talents through hard work and believing in themselves. Many of his former students are school band directors in the Houston area or are in university bands across the southeastern United States.


Willowridge Principal Christine Criner Smith nominated Thornton, 54, for a prestigious teaching award. She floored him when she made a surprise announcement during a school assembly that he had won.

The Missouri City resident has been selected as one of 10 recipients of the Outstanding High School Teachers sponsored by the Texas Exes and the College of Education at the University of Texas. Thornton will be honored Feb. 27 in a special ceremony in Austin, where he will receive a \$2,250 cash award and a commemorative sculpture.

Under his direction, the Willowridge band has earned more than 200 awards and has performed at numerous events, most recently the Super Bowl XXXVIII tailgate party. On Martin Luther King Jr. Day, they marched in the parade and competed in the high school band contest, winning the large band competition over schools from Texas and Louisiana.

The band has marched in the Tournament of Roses, the Orange Bowl and Gov. Rick Perry's inauguration parades, among others. In 2005, band members will travel to Hawaii to march in the King Kamehameha Day parade.

"He is able to bring together

a lot of students who come here from different schools as one band with one sound," Smith said. "Music is a personal attribute. He gives that to all the kids. It's a gift."

Maurice Ross, band director at Christa McAuliffe Middle School, considers Thornton a mentor. Ross was a student of Thornton's at Texas Southern University and was an assistant band director at Willowridge for four years.

"He can take the students who feel the least about themselves and turn them into confident people and great performers," he said. "He shows a child that he has no doubt that they can meet his high expectations."

"As far as teaching is concerned, he is one of the most positive influences in my life."

As Willowridge band director, Thornton oversees the program's components of majorettes, color guard, drill team and the jazz, concert and marching bands. The marching band is active during football season; concert band practice begins in the spring.

He said credit for his success also belongs to his assistant directors, Dell Hill and Robert Jackson; drill team

leaders Meredith McCall and Letisha Kelly; and an active band booster club of about 120 parents led by Willowridge parent Gwen Carter. He also credits Fort Bend ISD.

Thornton grew up playing music at St. John's Baptist Church in the Third Ward. After graduating from Yates High School, he earned a bachelor's degree from Texas Southern University and a master's from University of Houston, both in music education. He plays all of the brass instruments with main emphasis on the trombone. Thornton taught for seven years at both Texas Southern University and Forest Brook High School before teaching at Willowridge.

While studying at TSU, Thornton found a mentor in band director Benjamin Butler, for whom he later worked. "He taught me how to use my passion for music. He dedicated long hours and he instilled excellence. He had a God-given talent to motivate students. I wanted to be just like him."

At the end of each school year, Thornton evaluates himself as a music teacher.

"I evaluate my teaching to see if I've reached students by testing their musical knowledge and by asking them for their feedback," he said. "I am dedicated to trying to perfect myself and my teaching.

"One incentive for them to work so hard and learn classical music and maintain standards is that then we will play some of music they like."

Thornton typically arrives at 7 a.m. and stays until 9 p.m. Band students have a long day, too, attending classes during the day and rehearsing after school. To Thornton, the lessons are not just musical. He tries to show students how their hard work and commitment to music helps shape their lives.

"Musical lessons and long hours of practice will enable them to discipline themselves to listen and succeed at different jobs, and learn how to work with others," he said.

Willowridge senior Christopher Rose, 17, was inspired by Thornton to go to college. The trombonist is heading to Prairie View A&M University to study computer science and minor in music. He feels his hard work during the past four years will help him in the long run.

"Since my freshman year, I have changed more than just as a musician. I was shy as a freshman and now I'm a different person," Rose said. "Mr. Thornton has helped all of us harness our talents. He is like a father to us."

Throughout the school year, Thornton brings in musicians to play for and talk to his students about music in their lives. In the summer, he oversees a six-week jazz workshop where Houstonarea students ages 14 to 21 can learn how to play jazz and about the jazz music business.

Thornton is the president of the Texas Black Music Educators Association and a member of several other professional societies. He was named the WHS Campus Teacher of the Year in 1991. His wife, Michele, works as an engineering technician at Center Point Energy. Both of their children are teachers. Ronald is a Sam Houston High School band director and Monique teaches kindergarten at Bastian Elementary School.

After 14 hours of teaching music, Thornton listens to music when he gets home and plays with his 15-month-old grandson, Tyron. His tastes run from jazz — especially trombonist J.J. Johnson, Count Basie and Duke Ellington — and to classical, which he listens to with an ear toward music for his concert band to play.

Thornton also directs the orchestra at Brentwood Baptist Church and freelances as a professional jazz trombonist. He has played with the likes of the Temptations, Aretha Franklin, Stevie Wonder and Lena Horne.

"I love all types of music and try to put as much passion into my music as possible," he said.

His son knows that firsthand. The younger Ronald Thornton, also a trombonist, grew up spending time at his father's rehearsals when he wasn't practicing and performing for his middle school, high school and college bands.

"I was inspired to become a music educator myself when I would see the looks on peoples faces when they heard his band play," said Thornton Jr. "It made me proud to see how my father affected people's lives. He's also a father figure to many of his students. I decided it was something I wanted to do, too."
